here isn't a child baptised these days that hasn't the moment captured on at least a dozen phones or films because its such a memorable moment, and whether people are infrequent visitors or daily attendees, when it comes to a new child, every set of parents want that child baptised. The days of it being a must do moment are long gone and people freely ask, of their own choice and without pressure, to have their child baptised and on the day of baptism promise to raise the child knowing and worshipping God in it's life. That promise isn't made to the priest or deacon but to God Himself and it is a sacred vow. Parents and Godparents profess the faith and take baptismal promises on behalf of the child and are sent out into the world to let that faith grow in them as a family and in the child as a new Christian in the world. And so the photos begin. Its sad to think that for many people when the phones are put away and the sausage rolls are eaten that that's the baptism over and done with, that it goes into the memory bank as a pretty moment, one where we all dressed well and were so proud of a new life, but one that doesn't really mean we change or do anything. We all know that's true for too many. And yet the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord reminds us of the great gift that faith is and the gift baptism is in giving us blessing, direction and purpose, but also asking us to commit. In a world that is so slow to commit to anything beyond our own comforts, why not use this weekend as an opportunity to think about how we live out our baptism, live out our faith every day, as parents, grandparents and godparents and as baptised Christians ourselves. Could we be better Christians? Do we really commit to God and our faith or do we just say the right thing and look the part? Is our faith a way of life or an inconvenience that just asks too much? Theres a story told of a pig and a chicken who were out for a walk one day. The pig wasn't too bright and tended to repeat everything that others said or suggested. The chicken remarked "Those are very nice people down in that house down there." "They are indeed" replied the pig, "they are very nice people." "They are very good to us" continued the chicken.
