# Ballyclog & Donaghenry Parish Bullecin 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time 26th January 2025

n Monday the world will mark Holocaust Memorial Day which tries to keep in our minds the horrors of the past century, not as a way of frightening us, but as a way to always remember the power humanity has to bring about good or evil, and to remind us of what can happen when people lose their heart, lose their goodness, lose their sense of care and respect for each other. It would be wonderful to be able to believe that the world of today has rid itself of cruelty and hatred, but sadly none of us can, because without the faintest strain on our minds we can summon images of violence, destruction and barbarity that happen daily under the banner of national interest or of the worst of the ideologies of our age. It reminds us that every generation must stand for what is good, must defend the innocent, help the downtrodden and work to achieve the peace and freedom every soul deserves. Its rightly said that darkness doesn't exist in itself but that rather it is just the absence of light, and that evil is similarly the absence of love and of goodness. And for Christians the source of love and goodness is our God, our Christ who in today's Gospel proclaimed His modus – to bring good news to the poor, liberty to captives, sight to the blind, freedom to the downtrodden, favour to all. And in those words, we can all find a lesson. Our world needs goodness now more than ever before. We can easily sit back and tut and say the warzones of 2025 aren't here, but in living history we lived in a place of hatred too and look at the damage it caused. It is so easy for society to let hated slip in through it's doors, and are we really that far removed from those former ways? In life it can be easy to find a focus of hate, it can be people of a different ethnicity, creed, opinion, profession or status, and so quickly it can become the norm to dam them by word or deed. How shameful if that became our part of the world. Yet history teaches us that while it is so easy for hatred to loom over the world, the bright light and loving actions of good people will always win, because God is on their side. Your words and actions are the bright light of God's goodness here and now, if you let them be but it takes great courage to stand bravely for what is right. In your society, school, community, workplace, club - your wherever - always remember that harmony, goodness itself can only live and thrive if you make it happen. To judge the hatred of the world is easy, to judge the hatred of our society is much harder but much more necessary. A wind of change blows through each generation, let that change be one where your goodness overcomes every ill, where your love crushes every hatred no matter how tiny, where your life proclaims the mission of Christ and where in the words of today's Gospel "this is being fulfilled today even as you listen". When we remember the past wrongs of the world it's honourable and dutiful but remember them so that you can become the right and the goodness of the world still to be.
