s Bible stories go the tale of the Prodigal Son is probably one of the best known and is one we can all identify with in some way or other, because at times we've all fitted into the shoes of each of the three main characters – times when we've messed up and needed to say sorry, times when we've been a bit hurt and have needed to forgive and times when we've sat on the side-lines of life and given a great big humph to all that's going on in other people's lives or in the world. As always, it would be so easy to delve into the life of the begrudging son and see how we could all shape up a bit better, but none of us really need reminding of that. Instead it doesn't do any harm to reflect on the younger son, the one who was the wastrel but came good, not so much for the fact that he sinned or that he sought forgiveness but for the fact that he summoned up the confidence to ignore the mumblings of others and tried to have the confidence to start life over again. When it comes to faith we all need a little confidence at times – the confidence to really believe and trust in God, the confidence to stand for our faith in the world, the confidence to try to do the right thing when all around says otherwise, the confidence to never give up and always try one more time to be the best that we can be. Sometimes I think we need more confidence now than ever because of the type of world we live in – not so much for us older chaps, but especially for younger people. For all the great advances of the age and for all the great rallying cries for one cause after another, the world has gotten a lot smaller and judgemental and people can very easily be afraid of what others think, what others will say or just of the big mouthed, self-assured opinions of someone who doesn't even know you but feels they can write about you, type about you or rubbish you for whatever reason. The Prodigal Son knew that people would be like that with him, but he knew he wasn't happy as he was, he wasn't happy that his mistakes, his sins and his misjudgements had brought him down to the level of the swine in the pen, and he knew that only he had the power to make himself happy again. All he had to do was rise above the opinions of others and try to put it all right. And God, through the people who loved him, helped the Prodigal Son start over again and be happy again in his life. Today if you're afraid of what others think or say, if you're afraid to do what you believe, afraid to try to be happy in life for fear someone else will comment – be like the Prodigal Son, ignore those people and just forget them. So many people can have so much to say and their words can strip people of the little confidence they have, don't let that happen to you. Confidence isn't thinking you're better than everyone else, it's realising that you have no reason to compare yourself to anyone else. We all have one chance at life, use it well and live it well, live it with trust and confidence, live it for God and for good.
